Open the Meeting

Annette Atkinson thanked everyone for attending the joint work session and turned the meeting over to Nick Delia and John Nickerson of JLN, Associates, Inc.

JLN Study

Nick Delia presented a power point presentation of the Final Study dated June 24, 2024, of the Fire and EMS services for Delaware Water Gap Borough, Middle Smithfield, Smithfield and Price Townships'.

The general assessment process, community hazards, participants statistics, recommendation and summary were reviewed. (copy of the presentation is attached)

Mr. Nickerson stated that calls for EMS providers incorporated into the report are from 2020-2022. 2019 did not include that that was the beginning of the COVID pandemic.

He also stated that calls for Fire Companies incorporated into the report are from 2018-2022. He stated that not everyone has the help they need, as by the mutual aid requests shown in the report.

He stated that they are very impressed with the Monroe County Public Safety Center and with the the Monroe County Office of Emergency Management.

Questions and Answers were reviewed verbatim of slides 31 through 46.

Recommendations 1 – 11 were reviewed verbatim of slides 47 through 61.

Following the presentation, Mr. Delia asked if anyone had any questions.

- 1. Deb Boyle, BEC asked about the equipment replacement list that was used to create the reports. Mr. Delia said yes, he was given a list.
- 2. Lisa Paulette, DWG Council thanked JLN for the report and will take it back to council members and the fire company. She stated that they have no inventory, no list of inspections of equipment. Nick said that they need strategic planning in place so that you can see what is coming and budget for it. He said all the municipalities should have this in place.
- 3. Nick Delia stated that it doesn't matter what department you are in, the elected officials need more input, and the companies need to share their information with them, so they are not surprised.
- 4. Jason Witcraft, Shawnee Fire Co asked how they replace trucks, when they cost from \$800k to \$1.4 mm, and the truck takes 4 years to receive, now that they are given money based on population. Nick said everyone needs what they have, but as a group, everyone is like a regional

fire department, even if you don't have a lot there is a lot of equipment/trucks out there in our area.

- 5. Gail Kulick, BEC said the data is only as good as what you do with it, she asked if JLN was going to revisit or follow up with another study. Nick said no. Everyone can run reports in excel. Reach out to him for a full walk through on how to use Excel to put in the date and addresses and map it in GIS points to see where all of your calls are coming from (i.e., create a "heat map" to forecast needs).
- 6. Debbie Kulick, BEC asked if JLN has a study on individuals paying with credit cards. He said no they do not. Nick said the elected officials need to know from BEC what is coming in and going out. Deb Boyle stated that they do know what comes in and goes out. Nick said based on what he was given by BEC, you cannot tell.
- 7. Mike Dwyer, MST said he did not see in the report if there is duplication of equipment or trucks, or where the needs are. Nick said MCFC had a truck and DWG needed it and through them communicating, DWG got the truck. Strategic plans that would show what everyone has to determine where the needs are is needed for both fire and ems companies.
- 8. Jason Witcraft, Shawnee Fire Co., asked about apparatus and if there is duplication. John Nickerson said they did look at it carefully and the fire companies need to build out the apparatus and when it's needed, work with the other fire companies, meaning, if you buy this then we buy that, and both of us benefit, use mutual aid to help both companies.
- 9. Nick stated that overall, the emergency services system is pretty healthy for this area, but all need to start thinking about paid employees for fire companies. It's going to happen, and everyone should start looking at it as a group.
- 10. Mark Oney, MST, said the fire department have regional meetings and asked if they do strategic planning. Nick said to some extent, for example, they all joined together with the county and bought the radios.

Mark also said you can't get volunteers, but one group has no issues in getting volunteers; Jason Witcraft said it depends on locations. Gail Kulick said it comes down to the number of hours and pay. Nick Delia talked about ems companies meeting to agree on common standards and a common rate of pay, to prevent "stealing people from each other"

In closing Nick said, open communication is the way to go, open and honest and the willingness to look at the end goal.
